
BREATH OF THE SPIRIT



Feasts & Holy Days

St Thérèse of the Child Jesus (Lisieux), 1 October

This saint, also known as the Little Flower, was a Carmelite nun who lived a cloistered live of obscurity in the convent in Lisieux. She entered the convent at 15 & died in 1897 at the age of 24. She was canonized in 1925. In 1997, Pope John Paul 11 proclaimed her a doctor of the church, the 3rd woman to be so recognized.

St Teresa of Jesus (Avila), 15 October

St Teresa was born at Avila, Spain in 1515. At twenty years of age she entered the Carmelite Order. She was instrumental in reforming the rule of the Order. She wrote many books on mystical theology considered by Popes Gregory XV and Urban VII to be equal to those of a Doctor of the Church. She died at the age of 67. In 1970, the Church gave her the title of Doctor of the Church. She and St. Catherine of Siena were the first women so honoured.

Doctor of the Church (Latin doctor "teacher")

title given by the Catholic Church to saints whom they recognize as having been of particular importance, particularly regarding their contribution to theology or doctrine.

In the Western church four eminent "Fathers of the Church" attained this honour in the early Middle Ages: Saint Gregory the Great, Saint Ambrose, Saint Augustine, and Saint Jerome.

In the Eastern Church three Doctors were pre-eminent: Saint John Chrysostom, Saint Basil the Great, and Saint Gregory Nazianzus.

Female Doctors of the Church

St Catherine of Sienna (1347-1380). She is credited with Persuading the Pope to return to Rome from Avignon.

St Teresa of Jesus (Avila) (1515-1582). Her writings are credited with inspiring church reforms.

St Terese of the Child Jesus (Lisieux). The Basilica of Lisieux is a large pilgrim site in France

St Hildegard of Bingen (1098-1179). She was a Benedictine

abbess and mystic.

Eileen O'Connor



Eileen Rosaline O'Connor co-founded a community of nurses – Our Lady's Nurses for the Poor (OLNP) – also known as the Brown Nurses – to provide free nursing services to the poor in Sydney in 1913.

In recognition of her mighty spirit, the enquiry into her cause for canonisation is underway...only the second in Australia to have this process commenced.

She was born on 19 February 1892 in Melbourne, eldest of four children of Irish parents. When she was 3, Eileen fell from her pram and severely damaged her spine. Despite several opera-

tions nothing could be done to alleviate the terrible pain she endured.

A member of a devout Catholic family, Eileen irregularly attended the Richmond parish school. With few friends of her own age and little opportunity for the normal preoccupations of childhood, she turned to her family and to her religion for consolation.

In 1902 the family moved to Sydney. When in 1911 her father died, her mother faced great financial difficulty and sought help from a friend, a priest who introduced her to the parish priest of Coogee, Fr Edward McGrath, a fellow member of the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart. He found accommodation for the family and witnessed the courage with which Eileen met her disability.

Eileen received a visitation from Mary, mother of Christ, who encouraged her to accept her suffering for the good of others. She told McGrath of this and he shared his hope of establishing a congregation of nurses to serve the poor. Eileen accepted the challenge and on15 April 1913 she moved into a house at Coogee, known as Our Lady's Home, which would serve as a convent for the new congregation.

After some initial difficulties a small community of seven called Our Lady's Nurses of the Poor, elected Eileen as their first superior. The work of the Brown Sisters consisted of visiting the sick poor in their homes and in nursing them and the frail aged. Eileen supervised this work and directed the spiritual development of the congregation.

She provided strong leadership and direction despite being almost entirely bedridden. She died on 10 January 1921 of chronic tuberculosis of the spine and exhaustion. She was buried in Randwick cemetery but in 1937 the body was exhumed and reinterred beneath the chapel at Our Lady's Home. The congregation continues at Our Lady's Home at Coogee with three additional houses.

Prayer for the Beatification of Eileen O'Connor

O God Who raised up your servant Eileen to enrich Your Church with a new congregation, devoted to the spiritual and corporal assistance of the sick and dying poor, Grant that through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, she may be honoured with the privilege of Beatification of Our Holy Mother the Church. We ask this through Christ our Lord. AMEN

Queensland Community Alliance



The Queensland Community Alliance had the Founding Assembly in the Brisbane City Hall on August 30, 2017. The Alliance is a community organising network working for the common good in south-east Queensland. Alliance members include some of Queensland's largest faith groups, charities, unions, community organisations and ethnic associations.

The founding assembly commitments are to get better care for people with mental illness, disability or who need aged care, as well as working to fix a broken training system, and to end exploitation at work.

A group of seven parishioners from St Patrick's travelled in to St Stephen's Cathedral, we attended Mass at the small chapel and then walked across to City Square where we met Archbishop Mark Coleridge and the other Catholic groups assembled in the square.

The Archbishop led the Catholic contingent into City Hall and he blessed the assembled groups and people as part of the program. The assembly was very well run and we heard some moving stories about the hardship people can encounter when the system is broken.

State Premier, Annastacia Palaszczuk, agreed to recognise the Alliance as organised civil society, to support its commitments and if re-elected, to attend the next Assembly.

The meeting concluded with commitments from organisation leaders, including our Archbishop, to support the Community Alliance.

The Year in Review

St Patrick's Conference is a call centre where our members respond to requests for assistance from the local "community". This "community" covers a huge area- Beenleigh, Eagleby, Stapylton, Jacobs Well, Ormeau, Pimpama, Mt Warren Park, Windaroo, Edens Landing, Bethania, Waterford East etc.

Our aim is always to keep families together, a roof over their heads and some food in their pantries. Many who come to us for assistance have fallen through the cracks of life. It only



takes a sickness, job loss as in hours being cut or total loss, to put a family, whether they be couples (with or without children) or singles in a very vulnerable state indeed. We assist people who are suffering mental anxiety mainly due to the circumstances they are facing.

If you could imagine for a moment in your own life something devastating happening, who would you turn to? We would all like to think that our families or friends would come to our aid and in most times of trouble they do. However, if you have relocated here because of family breakups or domestic violence you would have no one to assist you. That is where the Society of St Vincent de Paul comes in. The society has been operating in Queensland since 1894 and is recognised as a Catholic based organisation which gives assistance to the marginalised.

Our aim is to give a hand up not a hand out. However the hand out is usually the first step. We are proud of the fact that we never turn anyone away as far as food is concerned. We are open Monday to Friday from 9.00am to 1.00pm. Our Helpline number is 3287 3788.

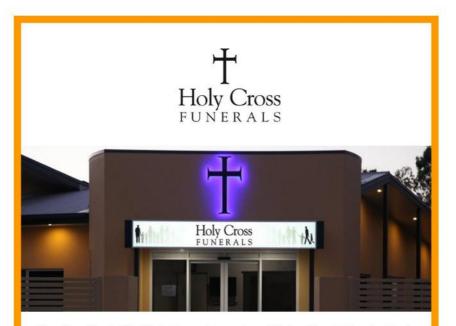

A Colourful and Remarkable Woman

Most of you would know Theresa by her beautiful singing voice. She has been an anchor in our Parish choir since she arrived in our Parish, some five years ago and she regularly sings in other musical groups during Mass. Her voice is so very beautiful that it lifts us up and it gives us other choir members and parishioners heart to sing.

Theresa Tarani Greig spent her first years on Manihiki Island in the Cook Island group. She was one of nine children brought up by her Grandmother. The family were practising Catholics and when Grandmother moved the family to Rarotonga, Theresa went first to a Catholic primary school and then high school.

Theresa married at 21 and soon had two small boys to care for. The family decided to move to Auckland, New Zealand, to give the boys better opportunities. Another three boys were born in NZ. The decision to move paid off, the boys flourished and two of them were offered jobs in Queensland. This presented Theresa with a dilemma as the remaining family were happy in New Zealand, but missing the two young men.

Theresa then made the brave decision to move the rest of the family to Queensland and landed in Beenleigh with Ben and Moetai, Theresa and the boys attend the 6pm Sunday Masses where she helps with the music, Ben is an altar server and Moetai trains to become one. They always help out at special Masses, Christmas, Easter and most recently the Multicultural Mass.

Cook Islanders are citizens of New Zealand. Manihiki is part of the Northern Cook Island group and Rarotonga the southern. The distance between them is around 1300km and the distance to Auckland is over 3000km. The islands are at the mercy of the sea. In 1997 a large tsunami destroyed much of the northern islands, including the grave headstones on Manihiki and nearby Rakahanga islands.

The family has now asked Theresa to help restore the headstones of three of her missionary ances-

tors. Aporo Orometua was the first indigenous missionary to preach the Gospel to the local people and to convert them and the King to Christianity.

In the middle of next year Theresa will travel with a group of family and friends to Manihiki and Rakahanga Islands to unveil the new headstones. We pray for a successful journey where the family will get an opportunity to reconnect with their roots.
