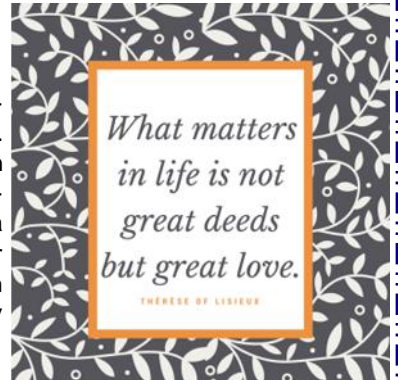

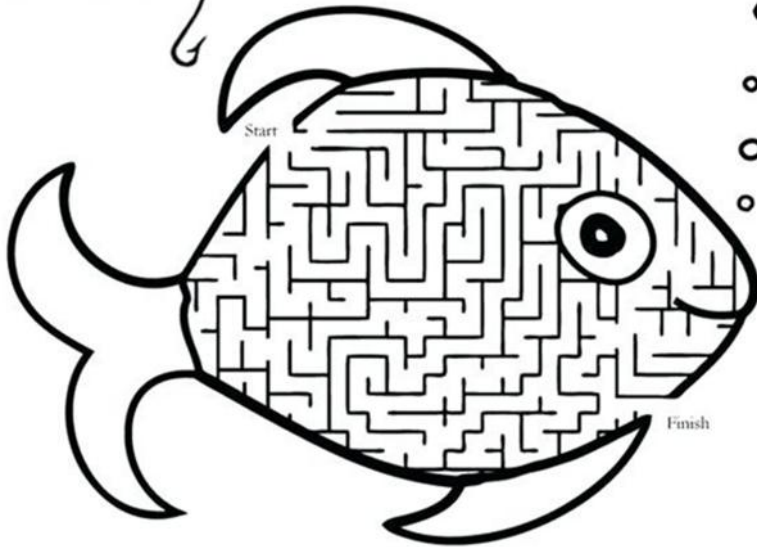

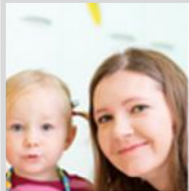

A vibrant Faith

Recently I visited my step son Fr Paul Chandler, who is assistant priest in St Paul's parish Kealba in Melbourne. Mgr Charlie Portelli is the parish priest and has in his 18 years there built two beautiful churches. Around 2400 attend the weekend Masses and their devotion is obvious. Week day masses are at 9:30 am and while was there the school holidays were in progress. I was surprised at the numbers attending these masses. I believe there would have been around 100 to 120 in the congregation made up of all ages, from school children to a 93 year old lady. Altar servers are readily available as these are school children who wear the black soutane and while surplice and are so reverent and devout.

It was winter time and still the numbers were there. I walked to the church when the temperature was 7 degrees and the chill factor, due to 50kph winds, made it feel like 2 degrees. I made good time walking the 2.5 kms that morning! The interiors of the Churches are made for a prayerful time. Both have stained glass windows, six of them in St Paul's, were obtained by the vigilant internet browser, the Monsignor, who spotted them for sale from a Presbyterian church in North America, which was closing down, sadly. The marble tiles were obtained from the Crown Casino, which did not like their colours! Their loss the Church's gain.

The Rosary and litany of Our Lady, with trimmings, are recited before Masses. This has a settling effect on the congregation and leads beautifully into the celebration of Mass.

Interestingly, too, both churches have a glassed in "cry" room, for noisy children. They are well positioned so that the occupants can participate in the celebration of Mass.

Statues and paintings are well chosen and add to the atmosphere of the Church.

When school resumed, classes were brought to morning mass. the year 4's attended St Paul's and their reverence was noticeable as they entered with hands joined and in complete silence. They responded to the parts of the mass and most went to Communion. Some were non-Catholics and went up for a blessing. At St Mary MacKillop's church, it was the year 1's that attended. They were marvellous in their attention and, before Mass, I saw one boy pointing out to his friend the 12 Apostles surrounding Christ in the huge circular Stained glass window above the altar. I believe this was as good as a prayer for the young man.

My time in these parishes was one of faith strengthening and I enjoyed it immensely.
