THE CHRISTMAS STORY AS TOLD BY LUKE

"Glory to God in the highest heaven,
and on earth peace among those whom he favours!"

SAINT NICHOLAS

St Nicholas—The Story of the true Santa Claus

That jolly fat old man in a red suit known as Santa Claus that we see in stores every year was actually a real person who lived many years ago and was a holy bishop. The name Santa Claus is Dutch for Saint Nicholas, whose feast day is celebrated on the 6th of December.

Saint Nicholas was born in what is now Turkey around the middle of the 3rd century. His parents were devout and wealthy and provided him with a Christian upbringing and education. He later became the Bishop of Myra in Lycia.

Saint Nicholas is remembered for his great faith, for his charity and his love for children. His faith was so great that he calmed a stormy sea while on a trip to the Holy Land. For this reason sailors honour him as their protector.

He used his great wealth to help all who were in need. He built a poorhouse, homes for the elderly and a hospital. He tossed money bags through the window of a noble, but poor man who had three daughters wanting to get married. This has given rise to the tradition of hanging up stockings on Christmas Eve.

Nicholas died on December 6, 343 in Myra. This day, St. Nicholas' feast day, is celebrated throughout the world to keep alive the stories of his goodness and generosity, often by bringing treats and gifts to the children.

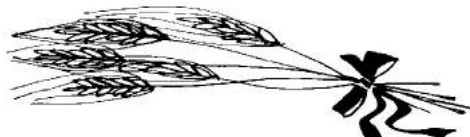

UP-COMING FEASTS AND HOLY DAYS

St Andrew, Apostle - November 30

Saint Andrew was Saint Peter's brother, and was called by Jesus along with Peter. We know very little about Andrew except that he was a disciple of Saint John the Baptist.



Immaculate Conception - December 8

The feast of the Immaculate Conception celebrates the most pure and sinless conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

St Lucy - 13 December

Lucy was a young Christian martyr who died during the Diocletianic Persecution. She is venerated as a saint by the Catholic, Anglican, Lutheran and Orthodox Churches. She is one of eight women, who along with the Blessed Virgin Mary, are commemorated by name in the Canon of the Mass.

St John of the Cross - 14 December

John of the Cross was a reformer in the Carmelite Order of his time and the movement he helped initiate, along with Saint Teresa of Ávila, eventually led to the establishment of the Discalced Carmelites. He is also known for his writings, his poetry and his studies on the growth of the soul.

St Stephen - 26 December

St. Stephen is recognized as a saint and the first martyr in Christian theology. He was condemned for committing blasphemy against the Jewish Temple and was stoned to death circa the year 36.

St John, apostle & evangelist - 27 December

Saint John the Apostle, also called Saint John the Evangelist or Saint John the Divine was the author of three letters, the Fourth Gospel, and the Revelation to John in the New Testament. He played a leading role in the early church at Jerusalem.

The Holy Innocents - December 28

This feast commemorates the massacre of the children by King Herod in his attempt to kill the infant Jesus. These children were regarded by the early church as the first martyrs.

The Holy Family - December 30

The Feast of the Holy Family celebrates the human family unit, as well as the ultimate family unit: Jesus, Mary, and Joseph.

Mary, the Holy Mother of God - 1st January

This is the highest title of the Blessed Virgin Mary - Mother of God. This title was given to Mary at the Council of Ephesus in 421 AD. The council taught, however, that the humanity and divinity of Jesus could not be separated and that they exist in one person, with the implication that we can rightly give Mary the title of Mother of God.

The Epiphany of the Lord - 8 January

Epiphany originally celebrated four different events - the Baptism of the Lord; Christ's first miracle, the changing of water into wine at the wedding in Cana; the Nativity of Christ; and the visitation of the Wise Men or Magi. Epiphany now marks the end of Christmastide—the Twelve Days of Christmas which began with the revelation of Christ to Israel in His Birth and ended with the revelation of Christ to the Gentiles at Epiphany.

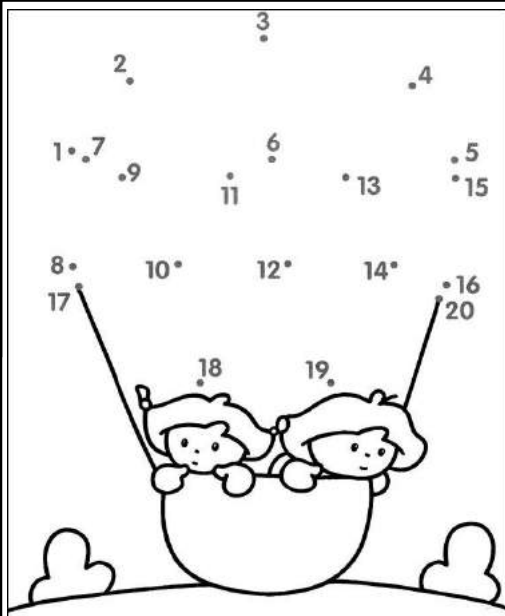

The purpose of the St Vincent de Paul Society is to fulfil two great commandments: love of God and love of neighbour. Vincentians seek out God's needy and assist them where they can. In the process, Vincentians deepen their own faith- a process of personal sanctification. Therefore the Society seeks to deepen the faith of all its members through its good works, integrating the social and ethical teachings of the Catholic Church. These values acknowledged:

- # The presence of Christ in all individuals.
- # Human rights of all individuals.
- # A commitment to social justice.

Thus the Society serves those in need regardless of creed, ethnic or social background, health, gender or political opinions. At the same time, we welcome as members Christians of other confessions, or people of other faiths who sincerely respect and accept the Society's identity and its principles.

2016 in Review:

From January to the end of October 2016:

- # We have assisted a total of 3255 persons – 505 single, 549 married or partnered, 441 single with children and 1750 children.
- # Total value of all assistance provided - \$44 411.33.
- # Assistance provided includes food, clothing, furniture, fuel chemist scripts and other one-off expenses such as emergency motel accommodation.
- # Each year we give out 100 Christmas Hampers in order to cheer up the lives of needy families and their children.

In order to assist such a large number of people, we have been able to receive funding from a variety of sources:

- # Easter raffle- A profit of around \$900.00.
- # We are able to draw funds from the profits of Vinnies stores in our region. Unfortunately we do not have a store in our area (the Society is actively looking for a suitable site) and so we take this opportunity to thank the New Hope Centre in York St who have generously agreed to help those clients who are unable to easily reach the nearest Vinnies shop.
- # Winter Appeal. This was held in June and thanks to the generosity of our parishioners we realised in excess of \$3000.
- # Fund Raising Dinner. Held in July in the St Joseph's School Hall. A very enjoyable evening and our thanks to St Joseph's Primary School, Trinity College, Beenleigh High School and our Parish Youth Group for their involvement with catering, serving and musical contributions. Our profit on the night was nearly \$4000 and we are hoping that even more members of our community will attend in 2017.
- # Christmas Appeal. The dates for this appeal are 3/4th December and yet again we ask for your financial contribution. Donations large or small will be greatly appreciated.

As another year draws to a close, the Society would like to thank the various members of our community for their support and wish them a happy and holy Christmas.

ANOINTING MASS

ANOINTING MASS—OUR PRECIOUS GIFT FROM HEAVEN!

The first Friday of each month has become something special at St. Patrick's with the recent introduction of the Sacrament of the Anointing Mass at 9 a.m. In this beautiful traditional ceremony of the Catholic Church, the priest anoints the head and hands of his people with sacred oil, or chrism, to strengthen and protect against illness and evil. As in Biblical times, the priest usually uses specially-prepared olive oil.



Catholic anointing dates back to the teachings of Our Lord, when he sent his 12 chosen disciples (who were to become the Apostles) on their first mission: "Then Jesus summoned his 12 disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits...and to cure every disease and every sickness..." (Matthew 10) and added to by Mark: "They cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many who were sick, and cured them". (Mark 6: 13).

This commission to his disciples by Our Lord has become a rite of forming part of the seventh Holy Sacrament of the modern Church—a very important one, even though it is not often encountered. Originally known as the Sacrament of the Sick or Extreme Unction, it can only be administered by a bishop or a priest, and in its original form (once known as the Viaticum—a Latin name meaning "for the journey") it usually was administered to those nearing the end of their life. But Our Lord intended it also to strengthen and heal the living, and about 40 years ago, the Church revived this important function as the rite of "the Anointing Mass", giving it a far wider meaning.

The formal Viaticum rite retains its vital purpose as the blessing for the dying, bringing them the comfort of a holy death, and is something which every devout Catholic needs—which is why it is essential to call for a priest when someone is terminally ill. But it now has a wider meaning as the rite of the Anointing Mass, which revives Christ's original purpose of cleansing and healing.

Forming a solemn part of the traditional Holy Mass, the Anointing is intended principally for parishioners suffering some form of illness, but is extended to the elderly, and even younger people who wish to receive its blessing effect.

This was detailed by the Apostle James in his encouraging Epistle: "Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the Church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the Name of the Lord." (James 6: 14-15.) An important aspect of this Sacrament is Our Lord's promise that it can also bring the forgiveness of sin, if the person receiving it is truly penitent.

Our precious Anointing Mass is not found in every parish—we can thank our compassionate parish priest, Fr. Joseph Kanatt, for continuing it as a special feature (he also initiated our inspiring Holy Hour at 8 a.m. on Saturdays). And the greatest "Thank you!" we can give him, is to be there—to fill the Church-- for both of these important special Masses!
